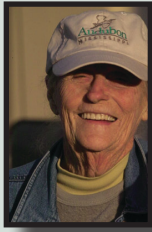


## About Us



Born of a desire to protect declining numbers of beach-nesting birds along Mississippi's gulf coast, the Mississippi Coast Audubon Society (MCAS) has grown to be the largest of five Audubon Chapters in Missis-

issippi. The Chapter's "Nest In Peace" project began in 1975, with the chapter chartered the following year by the efforts of primary charter member Judith Touns. Judy was a mentor to numerous birders in Mississippi and the country. She is much loved and missed by many. MCAS partners with several other agencies including the Pascagoula River Audubon Center to promote an awareness and concern for coastal habitats.

## Activities



In addition to its long-standing efforts to protect and monitor beach-nesting populations of Least Terns and Black Skimmers on Harrison County beaches, the chapter also actively promotes a wide range of bird monitoring projects, including the annual Christmas Bird Count, a long-running weekly inventory of the Seaman Road Lagoons, the Annual Great Backyard Bird Count, the Annual Judy Touns Bird-a-thon, the Coastal Bird Survey, and periodic monitoring of a number of sites for the Land Trust for the Mississippi Coastal Plain. MCAS is also committed to assisting Audubon Mississippi with long-term monitoring of the Pascagoula River and other Important Bird Areas (IBA).

MCAS serves Jackson, Harrison, Hancock, George, Stone, and Pearl River Counties.

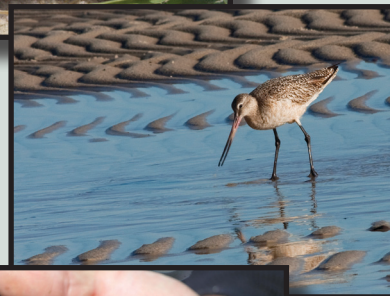


## Education & Conservation
